# BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Kanani primary school (KPS) is a public school located in Watamu location, Malindi Sub-county, Coast province, (about 4-5 km from watamu village). It is only a few kilometers inland from the Indian Ocean. The climate is generally hot and dry, with water access often posing challenges. The land is arid with moderate to poor quality of agriculture. Some families do fishing or are in subsistence farming, while others rely on unskilled labour opportunities in neighbouring villages. Many parents are low income earners, but value education for their children. Those attending the school are enthusiastic and demonstrate a profound willingness to learn.

The school opened its doors in 2009 and now serves over 378 students through class eight. The constituency Development Fund (CDF) has contributed three classrooms, although the school remains one shy of its goal of eight which would complete the plan for a "single stream" nursery – 8 school). This has been an extraordinary blessing to the community as many of the children once had to walk 5 km or more to attend school – or simply go without. The rate of illiteracy in the area remains high, although this is changing. In addition to more children overall being able to attend school since the opening of Kanani primary school. Several older students who were once forced to give up on their primary education at more distant schools have returned and many express a desire to take their exams and attend secondary (and beyond)

There is need for the school to have water tanks

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Kanani primary school is located in a rocky rural corner of Watamu location in Coast province, Kenya. It serves a number of students who until recently were unable to seek primary education owing to the long distance between their family shambas (or small subsistence farms) and the older school Watamu town. Kanani Primary school currently serves around 598 students in seven classrooms but the enrolment is expected to rise to over 600 by 2016.

Classroom to help overcrowding is a serious looming issue as well as a threat to educational attainment. Education is increasingly vital to helping students reach their goals in careers and literacy. Kanani seeks to build the capacity of their primary school by constructing four more classes and completion of one class.

It is in this undertaking that the community members and parents will be sensitized on their role to the school hence changing the people's attitudes towards the institution.

The school has a shortfall of four classes and learners are sharing classes e.g. class one shared among two levels.

The project will be undertaken at a cost of Kshs. 10 million

#### PAST DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

Before the school opened in 2009 the Constituency Development Fund (CDF) has contributed four classrooms in 2012. It came back and constructed fourth classroom and 6 toilets for boys. This move helped to reduce the great shortage of classrooms and sanitation facilities in the school.

Four classrooms were constructed by different donors in different years.

The above projects were implemented by the head teacher, the school management committee, community leaders and the Provincial Administration.

#### EXPECTED RESULTS

- The main focus of this project is to provide and improve the learning facilities in the school which are insufficient especially with the advent of free primary education in 2003 which greatly increased enrolment of pupils thus overstretching the existing learning facilities.
- This project is also an effort to contribute to MDG 7 on environmentally sustainability.
- In this respect, it will assist the learners in Kanani primary school to
  - i. To have appropriate and enough classrooms that will improve on learning
  - Acquire a friendly environment that will be safe and conducive for high academic performance
  - iii. Improve the enrolment of the pupils and ensure high retention rate.

The construction project is in confirming with Kanani primary school and development plan 2015 – 2017 which gives elaborate needs of the school. The school community which come through a wide consultation of school stakeholders. The order of priority.

- d. Building 4 more classrooms
- e. Construction of administration block
- f. Purchasing tables and chairs for the teachers
- g. Purchase of desks without rails for the girls
- h. 2 more toilets for teachers
- i. Making of play ground
- i. Erecting the school fence

# 1. Project Ownership

Kanani primary school construction is a project of the Kanani community though for a long time the community has been seeing the school should be constructed by donors.

The commitment of the community has been minimal always helping the school will continuously be constructed by donors and well wishers. This has not been the case hence the community has taken the initiative to manage the school as they have come to realize that the children will come to the school as theirs, hence the call to construct and improve on the school for better performance.

#### 2. Problem statement

The Kanani primary school has been constructed by well wishers and donors. This has led to parents and local communities not committing themselves to the improvement of the school.

Parents and local community has seen no role to play in the school management. The school is lacking four classrooms. Three classrooms are shared among 8 levels. ECDE, baby class, Kg1, 2 and 3, one class, and classes 1 and 2 share one class separated by cardboards and classes 3 and 4 one class.

#### 3. Existing potential

Kanani primary school is now a famous school due to its good performance compared to neighbouring schools. The institution is strategic considering that the nearest public schools are Watamu primary to the west, Jimba to the North west and Jacaranda to the east and to the south is Indian Ocean.

School population can increase tremendously if the infrastructure can be maintained and more classrooms are constructed. The school offers an opportunity to the local children to access education like other Kenyan children and as well as meet the millennium development goals or eradicating illiteracy by 2016

#### 4. Justification

Kanani Pry school is among the fast growing schools in Watamu town with a population of five hundred and ninety eight (598) has a potential of enrolling more children being an established school. The construction of more classes will allow the children enrolled to continue with education comfortably. Raising awareness on the parents' role in the school management will encourage parents to take their rightful role in running the school

To construct four classes to Kanani Pry School for improving the learning conditions of the children.

- To purchase twenty five chairs and twenty one tables for teachers
- To construct ramps to all classes by Jan. 2016
- To purchase and install rain water harvesting tanks of 100000 lts by Dec. 2015

The project beneficiaries to the Kanani Primary are the school children however this is a community project which will benefit the whole community.

- 3 water tanks are installed 10,000 ltrs each

- The community informed of its role in managing a public school

# 10. Project implementing strategy

- Kanani primary school project is crucial and essential. The incomplete class is not in use. The entire four classes are urgently needed. This will have to be undertaken early next year. The purchase of teachers tables and chairs hope will be done early next year.
- The project monitoring will be part and parcel of implementation to regulate and ensure the project implementation is done accordingly to schedule.
- An evaluation team will be composed and undertake the evaluation of the project before winding up of the project implementation. The project work experience will be documented and shared with education stakeholders for the purpose of learning and sharing.

#### 11. Project management

Kanani primary school well be project will be managed under a special committee whose sole responsibility will be to monitor and ensure that the project is implemented as planned. The project committee will be responsible for the project and answerable to the school management committee the governing body. The management of this project will be conducted with utter most care. All project experiences will be monitored, documented and shared with the school community and other education stakeholders

#### **B. JUSTIFICATION**

Kanani primary school is among the first growing schools in Watamu town with a population of five hundred and ninety eight (598). Has a potential of enrolling more children being an established school. The toilets need to be constructed to allow the children enrolled to continue with education undisrupted. The poor state of the toilets could lead to truancy, drop out and transfer leading to children lacking enough toilets and water. Construction of the toilets and water storage will help for retention of the pupils in the school raising awareness on the pupils in the school management will encourage parents to take their rightful roles in running the school.

#### D. OBJECTIVES

- To construct modern and safe toilets to prevent spread of diseases to the learners
